Nancy Haig, CIA, CRMA, CCSA, CFSA, is 2020-21 Chairman of The Institute of Internal Auditors (IIA) NA Board of Directors. In this role, Haig provides direction for The IIA's strategic plan in North America and oversees its implementation.

A member of The IIA since 1994, Haig has been an active IIA volunteer, including serving on the Publications Advisory Committee (PAC), the Editorial Board, and the Audit Committee. She also served as a member of the New York City Chapter's Advisory Committee, as well as on the North American and Global boards of directors. She is Director, Stakeholder Relations, on The IIA Global Board.

A published author and speaker, Haig is the principal consultant with PIAC, LLC, focusing on governance, risk and compliance. Her 40-year career in internal audit has included leadership roles in the financial and professional services, health care and pharmaceutical industries. Before PIAC, LLC, Haig led the internal audit and compliance functions of a global consulting firm.

Haig is a frequent conference speaker, and has also been featured in videos produced for The IIA's Audit Channel. In 2017, Haig received the Outstanding Contributor Award for her article, "Breaking Through," which was published in *Internal Auditor* magazine. In 2019, Haig received the John B. Thurston award for her article, "Your Personal Brand," which was the feature article in the February 2018 edition of the magazine.

In addition to certifications from The IIA, she has earned designations as a Certified Fraud Examiner (CFE), Certified Compliance and Ethics Professional (CCEP), and Chartered Bank Auditor (CBA). She has also earned the Certified in Risk and Information Systems Control (CRISC) qualification.
